## The Truth, a power of life and happiness

F all things, the Truth is the most precious. It procures us inexpressible joy when we are capable of feeling how worthwhile it is and also how wonderful its effects are. We are sensitive creatures who, when we live up to the Truth, can become glorious ones. We can, on the other hand, also live in error and destroy ourselves by degrees, for everything that it is not lawabiding — which is not in agreement with the Truth, and which doesn't follow out the perfect law of the Universe — cannot keep. What we are now able to make out of the Truth is no longer a matter of theology, but a scientific matter. We are able to follow, in detail, the results of the line of conduct we are doing our best to keep to, which we call "law-abiding": we observe that it has fortunate and blessed results. In carrying out that programme, we are in a position to receive all sorts of good impressions and kind sentiments, generous ones, that uplift our souls and bring them into contact with the glorious power at work throughout the Universe. That power makes our being vibrate to the very core, and carries us away with gladness when we are subjected to its action.

In the Word of God, there are examples of people who sang hymns of praise because their hearts were brimful of gladness. David, for instance, writes in one of his psalms: "My heart overflows with a good theme." Sensations of this nature are exceedingly favourable to the health and to keep up the vitality of every human being. Generally, however, people receive impressions that are the exact opposite to these and build up in them a record, a character, which is a great calamity. We are always happy or unhappy according to the sentiments we record and display! By developing noble, affectionate and benevolent sentiments, we build up a happy character and automatically establish communion with the Source of happiness, divine love, which manifests itself throughout the Universe in the greatest possible variety of creations.

The Universal Law leads us straight to that Source of happiness when we are docilely guided by its divine principles. It is like someone coming kindly and affectionately to us and holding out a hand to fetch us out of the darkness, of our wretched condition, into the sunshine, the light of the Almighty's grace.

That was the feeling I had when I wrote The Message to Humanity. The introduction points out that it was as if we were in a tunnel into which only the

It is inexpressible joy for us to be able to follow out the Lord's ways as proposed to us. When things take place around us that do not agree with the Lord's ways, we are capable of making the deficit good, because of the great blessing granted to us in this way.

Of course, when a heart has been reached by divine ways, which give rise to magnificent bursts of enthusiasm, the Adversary always tries to throw a wet blanket over that enthusiasm. The question then is whether we are going to allow ourselves to be bound hand and foot by the great Adversary — who knows us thoroughly.

If we do our best to live out the divine programme honestly, we shall succeed. For that purpose, we must be open and sincere, not look for any kind of excuse, and faithfully fulfil all the conditions. It is constantly balanced by justice and by real wisdom, and has admirable results. Lawless love cannot last, which is why people love one another today, but tomorrow love one another no more. Their love is not steady: it dulls and dies out at last. So, it is a deceptive love that hurts. It is hate in disguise.

It is a frightful thing to have been guided into error in that way by the Adversary. A woman loves her husband lawlessly, and a man his wife, and both their children, to obtain all sorts of advantages. They know no better and seek nothing else. It is easy to see that that love has nothing to do with divine love, which leads to life, even to everlasting life, and also immortality when it is expressed in sufficiently high concentration as in our dear Saviour's case. He was given a name above all other names, and received the immortality of divine nature. That is the glorious result obtained by the way he lived out divine love. We also are invited to achieve divine love. If we are surrounded by weak people, that gives us a magnificent opportunity to develop that love

#### A donkey's memory, and a bull's gratitude

PIETRO, an evangelist with his heart and soul in his mission, bringing the Good News of the Kingdom of God with spirit, has a rich store of experiences, for in the course of many years, he has travelled back and forth, and up hill and down dale, over a number of regions. With a heart sensitive to the language of nature, he has gathered impressions which have brought him blessing, so that he has vivid memories to feed his enthusiasm. Having also spent some time on the Mediterranean Sea island of Corsica in the service of the Gospel, he has told us, as follows, what he witnessed there:

"Yes, I love Corsica, a French 'island of beauty', often sung about by the poets, and whose enchanting coastline alternates between rocky stretches and sandy beaches, and which is surrounded by sparkling blue water when it is not assailed with rearing foam-capped waves. I also love its varied landscapes of pine woods and chestnut groves that give travellers some soothing impressions of peace. Its heaths are pervaded with a delicious scent of the myrtle and cistus flowering shrubs, and are embellished here and there with an occasional lentisk or arbutus tree, all of which impel you to fill your lungs with this invigorating air. I furthermore love its radiant sunshine that warms its fertile soil — its silver moonlight reflected in its rippling sea — and its starlit sky which brings to your lips these words of a hymn:

O Majesty, divine and holy, Monarch of all eternity, I bow to Thee, contrite and lowly: Rest at thy feet on bended knee.

While Corsica is a wonderful place, whose high-perched mountain villages present broad panoramas to the eye, it is still and

above all, a land of traditions where being warmly welcomed and hospitality are duties as sacred today as they ever were. Whether you are friend or stranger, a table is laid for you as soon as you arrive. Tasty bread, excellent cheese and generous wine are set before you with a warm sympathy that confounds you. 'Refresh yourself first. We can talk afterwards,' are the words which make the visitor feel quite at home, and immediately give him to feel that he is among friends.

There is another surprise for you when, along your way, you meet donkeys and goats, proud of their freedom, not to mention cows with their calves, and sows with their piglets. Greater still is your astonishment when, at the sound of their master's voice, all these creatures come forward instantly. Without a hint of holding back, the donkey turns up for the job to be done. Whether to carry its master, a load of wood, or a sack of sand, it is always willing. What a splendid animal! It is as sure-footed as it is faithful, and nothing is able to dishearten it when it is well treated. In time past, before the arrival of the motor van, it was donkeys that used to carry the wholesome daily bread from village to village

Carlo, the baker, was the lucky owner of one of those donkeys whose most important job was the delivery of bread. Pulling a twowheeled cart — loaded with big fresh golden crusty loaves, whose appetizing smell would make mouths water all along his way — this male donkey would go forward at an even and dignified pace, fully aware of his responsibility. So often had he followed the same round, that his master had no need to direct him or to tell him when to stop, he knew everything by heart. He had a lot of free time in which to seek his food for himself, because, due to his kneading and baking, his master was too busy to give him much attention or to find fresh grass for him.

In contact with someone who is respectful and animated with kind and good sentiments, it is impossible to be irreverential. Nobility is a magnet that attracts and encourages. It prevents your being lacking in integrity or in civility, or keeping sentiments opposed to law-abiding, that is to say, to love. So, you are urged to build up sentiments which lead to the fullness of life, which is eternal life. Eternal life is the continuation of the work of the organism when it is in quite favourable conditions, that is to say, when nothing wears out and everything goes on in such a way as to only produce life. So, all improbity, all rudeness and every selfish feeling must be put away, for those failings prevent one from feeling the glorious vibrations of divine grace, and also prevent one from being sufficiently replenished by the power of God's Holy Spirit. ## From desert to paradise

We quote the following entire article from Swiss Frenchlanguage newspaper *Tribune de Genève* on the 18th of May 2022, written by Virginie Lenk in the column "Monde" ("World"):

Why it is so hard to slow down the advance of the desert?

The ambitious intention to build a plant barrier [the Great Green Wall] in sub-Saharan Africa against the advance of the desert sands, has been bogged down for 15 years. This is one of the challenges of COP15, the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), held in the city of Abidjan, in the African country of Ivory Coast.

At COP26 [the 2021 United Nations Climate Change Conference] in Glasgow, Jeff Bezos, the boss of Amazon, promised 1 billion US dollars. In Paris at the beginning of 2021, international donors pledged 19 billion US dollars. The money is there, but the Great Green Wall is stalling, to the point of casting doubt on the completion of the project, which was promised 8 years ago.

The initial project was to plant vegetation on a strip, 8,000 km long and 15 km wide, from the countries of Senegal to Djibouti, and thus reforest 100 million hectares of dry land in the sub-Sahara by the year 2030. The wall is misnamed, it is rather a mosaic of forest, agricultural and pastoral lands, which extends over 11 countries. Since then, the project has been modified,

and it is a matter of restoring the lands on a much wider strip.

If we are talking about it again, it is because the UN COP15 to combat desertification, is currently taking place in Abidjan. Less well known than the COPs on climate change, but no less important, because, according to the UN, 40% of the world's land is degraded today throughout the world, and Africa is the most affected continent.

Since the launch of the Great Green Wall in 2007, the results have been very pessimistic. Only 4 million hectares have been reforested out of the 100 million targeted. There are many reasons for this delay.

#### Local disinterest

Some of the countries in this green strip are politically unstable or at war against jihadism. Cronyism and corruption are mentioned: the Panafrican Agency of the Great Green Wall (PGGW), which supervises the project, has distributed 170 million euros in loans in 15 years. The World Bank disputes those figures and says that it is 768 million euros, some of which has been misappropriated.

Climate change also makes planting and watering more complicated, explains Mr Régis Peltier, an agroforestry researcher at CIRAD (the French Agricultural Research Centre for International Development, which works for the sustainable development of tropical and Mediterranean regions). "The rainy season is no longer continual, it can be interrupted by weeks without water. Before, it used to be the exception, now it happens every year."

Additionally, there is demographic pressure: "Today, there are 300 million inhabitants; by the year 2050, there is predicted to be 500 million," explains Mr Rémi Hémeryck, the CEO of the NGO (nongovernmental organization) SOS Sahel [sub-Saharan Africa].

#### **Long-term investment**

Plantation trees and cattle breeding must co-exist on collective lands. However, the local populations are often not sufficiently integrated into this enormous project, which many consider as coming from elsewhere. Mr Rémi Hémeryck has worked for a long time on similar large-scale reforestation projects. "This is a Tragedy of the Commons. No one really feels responsible. Once the trees are planted, cattle enter the area, and then there is fire. Conversely, trees entrusted directly to local people are still there after years."

There is also the problem of land ownership. Fleeing from desertification [the advance of the desert], populations from the sub-Sahara have moved southwards and have cleared the savanna trees. On these lands, they have no established rights. "These people have no interest in planting trees or sustainable management, because the land can be taken away from them," explains Mr Régis Peltier. According to him, more small grants would motivate people and enable them to cope with the hazards of life.

It should also be considered that the restoration of the soil is more difficult in the long run, explains Mr Rémi Hémeryck. "If you plant trees, you will harvest them in 3 or 4 years, but if you are talking about 'carbon fixation', there are time horizons of 20 years. So, it takes long-term investments, and the type of projects must be well thought out, especially in relation to their social dimension."

He cites the examples of the acacia-tree plantations in the country of Chad, for the production of "gum arabic". "We first had to create access to drinking water for the women who harvest the sap [which hardens into the gum]. In 10 years, there will be close to 100 villages that produce 1,500 to 2,600 tonnes of gum annually." A small step to stop the desert.

Reforestion is an absolute necessity that not only concerns the Sahara, but the whole world. It would

take too long and would be too superficial to go into the details here of the hydrographic balance, which is currently broken, and in which the trees play a major role. In any case, one who wants to reforest must be convinced of the importance of the project. When one knows that 40% of the world's soil is degraded by erosion, deforestation and "intensive farming", can one still ask if one should do anything? The financial means seems to be available, and some large investors seem to understand that the world is facing a serious decision, which could even be tragic. This is a good starting point, but it is not enough.

As we see in this situation that we are examining, the challenge is great. It is a matter of reforesting an 8,000 km-long strip, which means across the entire African continent, from east to west, from the countries of Ethiopia to Senegal. This is an immense project, which, one can imagine, faces many obstacles. The climate is one of them. The dryness in the desert areas, threatens the plantations. One must water them, but that is a big problem in such large areas. As the article also mentions, there is the co-existence with cattle farmers and their herds, which do not necessarily defend the same interests. The residents have other problems, which have the priority, such as the demographic explosion, which means, the large population increase. Also, if one doesn't know whether one will have anything to eat tomorrow, it will also be difficult to plan for the coming 20 years. Thus, many people find it a bother to feel responsible for a project that seems strange to them.

The difficulty of this project also consists of organizations that want to reforest in the middle of the desert. It would be better to start along the coastlines and the watercourses, before going inland. On the other hand, we know that reforestation is a part of the great plan of the Restoration of All Things, which God has foreseen for the benefit of humanity and the entire Earth. Currently, we are still under condemnation in this time period of the Permission of Evil. Consequently, all who want to work for good, will encounter opposition. That is also why it is so difficult to bring this project to a successful conclusion.

## Climate change and melting ice

From the Swiss newspaper GHI on the 2nd of February 2022, we quote an article that reports about the significant amount of ice that has melted in the last 20 years. We reproduce it in its entirety:

#### Dangerous acceleration of melting ice

Greenland: A study has quantified the phenomenon on the island, and its effect on the oceans.

It's as if the United States were covered by half a metre of water. Greenland's enormous ice sheet has lost about 4,700 billion tonnes of ice since 2002, according to calculations by Danish researchers at Polar Portal [a Danish institute that monitors the ice and the climate in the Artic], based on satellite data. Most of the ice loss is occurring at the edge of the ice sheet, where independent observations indicate that "the ice is shrinking, the ice sheet is receding in the fjords and on the land, and the melting ice is increasing on the  $\perp$  article, has already been reached. That is why we are  $\perp$ 

surface of the ice". This phenomenon alone has already raised the sea level by 1.2 cm.

Climate change is particularly alarming in the Arctic, where the rate of melting has increased 6 or 7 fold in 25 years, according to NASA. The cause: the warming of the water in the Arctic Ocean. According to climatologists, Greenland has enough ice to make the sea level rise by more than 7 metres, and Antarctica by nearly 50 metres, although these processes are very slow.

In a previous edition of *The Monitor*, we produced an article that described the pollution caused by the melting ice in the polar regions. The above article shows that a significant quantity of ice has melted in Greenland in the last 20 years. Why is the warming tendency greater at the poles, particularly the North Pole, than elsewhere on the planet? The quoted explanation to understand the temperature increase at the poles, is the melting of the ice. The white pack ice has the ability to reflect the Sun's ray. This ability to reflect is known by the term "albedo" and is expressed in percentages. Ice has an albedo of 60%, and snow can measure up to 90%. When pack ice melts, it changes the albedo, which, in turn, changes the energy exchange on Earth. All of that influences the climate. By melting, the ice makes room for the darker ocean. The latter thereby absorbs more of the Sun's rays than the ice floe (the sheet of floating ice), and ocean's albedo is between 5 and 10%. The absorption of warmth limits the chances of the ice floe renewing itself and increases the chance of accelerating global warming.

Eventually, the situation leads to a loop system: the absorption of the warmth produces a temperature increase, which, in turn, increases the melting ice and thereby the lowering of the albedo. Furthermore, the warming of the poles is increased by another element: the movement of warmth, which occurs in the atmosphere and the oceans, in the direction of the poles.

One can apply the term "polar amplification" to describe the significant climate change at the poles. But it does not affect the Arctic and the Antarctic in the same way. The South Pole is less affected by global warming than the North Pole, thanks to its enormous ice sheet and its extreme temperatures. With the increase of the global temperature, the ice surfaces in the Antarctic are melting six times faster than 40 years ago. In the Arctic, the air temperature is increasing twice as fast than the global average.

In addition to all of that, there is another phenomenon, which was described in the European newspaper 20 Minutes on the 16th of July 2021:

#### The Amazon, a source of CO<sub>2</sub> (carbon dioxide)

Environment: A study published on Wednesday in the journal Nature, confirms a worrying transformation in the planet's climate. A large part of Amazon is emitting CO, instead of absorbing it. Scientists have arrived at this conclusion after analyzing hundreds of air samples taken over a period of the last 10 years. The cause: deforestation, forest degradation, and temperature increases during the dry season. With the melting of the ice caps, the thawing of the permafrost, and the disappearance of the coral reefs, the decline of the Amazon Rainforest is one of "the tipping points" identified by scientists as key elements whose substantial modification could lead the climate system towards dramatic and irreversible change.

Deforestation, the pollution produced by our industrialized society, production, and the excessive consumption of energy, are all factors that have led to the current tragic situation.

There is only one remedy to fix that state of things: the observance of the Universal Law. Stop exploiting the Earth and its natural resources, to the extreme. We know that "the tipping point", mentioned in the above heading for the Great Tribulation, which was announced long ago in the Bible. But we also know that, according to the Bible, the New Heaven and the New Earth, will follow the current dispensation. They hasten with some other neighbours to the spot described. Champion looks lost, but if anyone goes to touch him, he shakes them all off in his fright. You have to keep an eye open for his sharp horns, although he is not a vicious animal. At last, they succeed

in backing him against the rock and in making a halter with a piece of rope, with which they lead him into an enclosure. There, they perceive that, in truth, the animal is blind.

Now begins the very difficult task of treating the patient. He cannot understand that compresses are going to cure him. Mrs S. knows the virtues of plants, and wants to do her best for him. But there is no time to lose if they are to be effective. Two strong neighbours come forward to help her husband hold the animal while she applies the compresses. She does succeed, but not without difficulty, for Champion is opposed to the treatment and struggles a lot.

One day, the neighbours are called away on business, and Mr S. does his best to hold the animal by himself. He has to stop, for the bull shakes its head with determination. Feeling that time was being wasted, Mrs S. then said: 'Wait a moment. I'll see what I can do on my own.'

Also feeling that nothing else could be done for it, Mr S. stepped back some distance, but not without some anxiety for his wife's safety. Then, he was able to witness a touching scene, which was impossible for him to have foreseen.

A few kind words accompanied with a deal of patting and stroking, appear to calm Champion down: 'Come on boy. I'm not hurting you. Let me do you good.' Holding a horn with one hand, she applies the compress with the other, as best as she can. The bull still shakes his head a little, but much less vigorously than before. Persevering along these lines with a gentleness that strives to be convincing, she at last wins Champion's trust. Not only has he given up resisting, but he begins to take pleasure in the treatment.

He is now quite willing to submit to the healing action of the application. Mrs S. is pleased; this initial result makes her happy. Champion has become aware of the soothing effect of the compresses. Now, he comes forward of his own accord to receive the treatment from the hands of his nurse. Then comes the miracle: the persevering application of the compresses restores balance, and a little while later, he is cured.

How splendid it is to be able to see! He sees the heath where all his friends are desperately waiting for him. They come and sniff him all over when he returns to them. When Mrs S. calls him to see how he is going, you should see with what eager steps he gallops to meet her. But she must be alone. If she has someone with her, Champion keeps away. One morning, for instance, husband and wife set forth together to the heath, and as was her habit, Mrs S. called the bull. Soon, the thud of the hooves of the lord of the herd, draws nearer and nearer, till at length he comes into sight, charging round a bush. But at the sight of Mr S., he stops short, hesitates and turns around, and stops once more at the sound of his name,

after years of globalization to encourage the opening of borders.

After the Berlin Wall, a symbol of a divided world, was destroyed in 1991, the number of barricaded borders has since exploded. From about 15 at the end of the Cold War, there are nearly 70 today. A jump linked, among other things, to "a setback of globalization," analyzes Mr Bruno Tertrais, the Deputy Director of the Foundation for Strategic Research, and a co-author, with Delphine Papin, of the French book The Atlas of Frontiers — Walls, Migrations, Conflicts.

The recent constructions are very different to the Berlin Wall model, which prevented people from escaping. Even the term "wall" seems to be outdated: "There are very few concrete walls. Most of the time, they are metal structures, made of sheet metal or wire mesh," says Mr Michel Foucher, geographer and author of the French book The Return of Borders (2016). The new constructions also serve other purposes. Some of them freeze conflicts — such as the one on the island of Cyprus, which has been divided, since the invasion by Turkey in the year 1974, between the Republic of Cyprus in the south, and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus [Northern Cyprus] — and the one between Israel and Palestine. But the frenzy in recent years has been focused on barriers that "prevent entry" into a territory. And that model appeals.

#### A need for "sovereignty"

Hungary (in 2015), the USA (in 2016), Lithuania, Greece and Turkey (in 2021)...and the latest, Poland. The parliament in Warsaw [Poland's capital], at the end of October [in 2021], confirmed plans for an "antimigration wall" on its border with Belarus. Traumatized by the latest rush of migrants against its barbed-wire fence, orchestrated by its neighbour: Belarus President Alexander Lukashenko, Poland is closing itself off, or rather, "is reaffirming what is 'at home' within itself, and what is 'at home' elsewhere". That is a "sovereign need", according to Bruno Tertrais.

That phenomenon — which has many factors, and which researchers say has long been associated with September 11, 2001 and the fear of terrorism — has another explanation: globalization. It began in the 1980s and made the borders "blurry".

The movement of goods and information, and the development of transport, set everything in motion. And the Western model of consumerism has become international. "There is more and more information about the state of the world and about opportunities elsewhere," analyzes Michel Foucher. "In 2015, it struck

me that the Syrians who arrived at the Munich train station all had mobile [cell] phones. [In that year, over a million refugees were welcomed in Germany (editor's note)]. They came with the idea of trying their luck elsewhere." With globalization, the number of international migrants, both legal and illegal, rose from 77 million in 1965, to 281 million in 2020, which is 3.6% of the world's population.

#### Between 6 and 18% of land borders

"It is because globalization produces as many illegal as legal flows of migrants, that there is a need for fences and for protection," adds Bruno Tertrais. The feeling of "slipping away" is caused by a lack of confidence in the system and its institutions. The migration crisis in 2015 — the unprecedented influx of migrants to Europe across the Mediterranean Ocean, mostly fleeing war or insecurity — didn't help the situation.

Result: The builders of walls today are not the same as yesterday. "Before, it was mainly the autocratic regimes that built walls. Today, it is the liberal democracies," says Elisabeth Vallet, an Associate Professor of geopolitics at the University of Quebec (UQAM) (in Montreal, Canada). "Walls are an immediate and rapid response of politicians to concerns about the control of territories and the flow of migrants."

However, fences are only on a small number of land borders: between 6 and 18%, according to The Atlas of Frontiers by Bruno Tertrais and Delphine Papin. But this further illustrates the inequalities, like the treaty of Europe's Schengen Agreement: the free movement of goods and people, for those who are lucky enough to be on the right side. According to a report by the Dutch NGO "TNI" (Transnational Institute) published in 2018: "The member states of the European Union (EU) and of the Schengen Agreement, have built nearly 1,000 kilometres of walls since the early 1990s to prevent refugees from coming to Europe."

Humanity is currently having an experience that will continue when the Reign of Justice is established on Earth. Globalization has increased, but this globalization also has consequences. It is clear that when borders are opened for markets, they will also be opened for workers, families and the poor. And that is where there is less agreement. When it is a matter of doing business, there is agreement, but when it is a matter of taking in other people, that is another question.

Globalization is defined as a phenomenon that has the tendency to increase the mutual dependency of national economies in a global market system. It affects the economy, which is the production and consumption of goods and services, as well as the financial sector (money and capital).

One sees that the individual is not included in those various exchanges, and that is precisely the problem. What sort of society give special rights to trade, to industry and to all sorts of money exchange, but builds a wall to isolate itself from the people of neighbouring countries? The rich are welcome, but the poor are not. On the other hand, globalization benefits the wealthy who want to move the production of their goods to foreign countries in order to profit from cheaper labour costs. Those who do not have the same means are simply excluded. And if they become unemployed, that is bad luck. There is indifference to the misfortune of others. All of that shows us that without brotherliness and sisterliness, true globalization is not possible.

It should not be forgotten that the intention of globalization is to boost the economy, but at the same time, political and business leaders are striving for the progressive introduction of a world government. That can be easily seen in Europe. And there, the gap between the rich and the poor will increase even more.

It is also interesting to see that since the Berlin Wall was torn down in 1991, about 70 new walls have been built

As we already said, the Reign of Justice, which will soon be established on Earth, will end the current state of things. There, love for others will rule as the sovereign master. Moreover, the first enemy to disappear will be money. Then, many conflicts will cease. Humankind will become brothers and sisters. ## News in brief of the Reign of Justice

I prayed for the authors of the persecution, so that the Lord would grant them light. That's when I began to well understand 'the ministry of reconciliation', and I practised with all my heart to fulfil it worthily. As I sought to live according to the Divine Programme, and to purify my heart, the Lord was able to give me

The Divine Revelation. That was the eyewash, the message of consecration, to come out of the lukewarmness of this last period of the Church (Laodicea). ...

Like all the Messengers of the Church of Christ, I had to pass a very strict course of training in tests, lessons and instructions, to be worthy of the ministry. ...

All of my experiences have unfailingly attached me to the Lord and to our dear Saviour, and I was able to bring to God's people the knowledge of his wonderful character, which never punishes! He is the Father of 'the prodigal child', and the God of all mercy and all compassion. ...

My desire to understand 'the mystery of life', became more and more passionate as I sanctified myself more to the Lord. By divine grace, I could remove the shroud that covers all people, and lift the veil that is spread over all nations. I could reveal the mystery in order to no longer descend into the grave, the message of the 'one among a thousand'. I never thought that I would be given this honour! ...

I was immersed in deeply joyful impressions when I wrote *The Message to Humanity*. Under divine inspiration, I dictated the first chapter, but I did not yet comprehend the importance of those lines. By reading and re-reading, I realized the extent and the greatness of this message. ...

Another deep truth that the Lord gave me, to give to God's people, was the fact that our dear Saviour is the Excellent Angel who is always with his Church during the Gospel Age, as he promised his disciples when he left them: 'I am with you always, even to the end of the age.' I understood that, for his own people, his Second Coming took place at his resurrection. What shall now occur is only for the world and will be through his holy Consecrated and those who have believed, which means, the dear Host of the Lord. I thus understood the words of our dear Saviour: 'You will do even greater things [than I do].'

The Lord also gave me to call the Host of the Lord into existence: the children of the Christ, who will be the firstborn of the New Earth. That is the beginning of the New Earth, of the wonderful time when the Spirit will be poured out on all people, firstly on the holy Host.
